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RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

RULES - All TBA Tournament Rules and Regulations will apply.

Tournament Accreditation Number A04/00023.

ELIGIBILITY - This tournament is open to all Adult bowlers who are affiliated with Tenpin Bowling Australia Limited.

NO REFUND AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE - Teams or Individuals who do not bowl in their allocated squads will not be entitled to claim a refund. Teams or Individuals who are unable to bowl in their event, can sell their spot to another competitor. Whilst the Tournament Committee will help where possible to reschedule entries, it is not the responsibility of the Tournament committee to sell or recover money for unused entries.

DRESS CODE - Bowler's must wear neat acceptable attire. No jeans, T shirts, tank tops or hats are to be worn whilst competing.

ENTERING AVERAGES - Each bowler must use their highest current league average as at the 30th June 2004 which has been established over a minimum of 18 games in a TBA Accredited League and including Touring Leagues.

GRADINGS - Based on averages submitted, entries will be Graded in accordance with the Australian Adult Championships Gradings Table

BOWLERS WITHOUT AN AVERAGE - Any bowler without an average as described, may apply to TBA for classification prior to submitting an entry. If no such application is received, then an entering average of 185 for Men and 175 for Women will apply.

Note: Any bowler may enter in OPEN Grade.

AVERAGE REVIEW - The Tournament Director reserves the right to review the average and regrade any bowler at any time. Participation using an incorrect average may result in disqualification.

REPLACEMENTS - Any change from the original Entry or line-up must be reported to the Tournament Room prior to the scheduled starting time.

GAMES TO BE PLAYED - In each Grade a three (3) game series will be played in Teams, Doubles and Singles.

MULTIPLE PARTICIPATION - TEAMS - The same five (5) bowlers may bowl together any number of times and in any different combination.

DOUBLES - Bowlers may have unlimited entries with the same or different partner.

SINGLES - Bowlers may have unlimited entries in their grade or any grade above their own classification.

ALL EVENTS - An All Events Champion will be declared for each average classification for which paid entries are received. Scores from each bowler's BEST appearance in Teams, Doubles and Singles will count towards their All Events total. Scores in the Mixed Doubles and Mixed Teams **will** count towards All Events.

Eligibility is subject to the payment of the **\$5.00 ALL EVENTS FEE.** This Fee must be paid BEFORE bowling in their first Event.

PRIZE FUND - Trophies, medallions, shirts, awards and any other prizes will be purchased from the total prize fund received in each event. The Championship prize fund distributed in cash or cheque, will be the balance remaining after purchases have been made and will be paid in the ratio of one (1) prize for every ten (10) entries, except in All Events where the ratio will be one (1) prize for every twenty (20) entries.

NOTE - Any matters arising which are not covered by these Tournament Rules will be determined by the TBA Tournament Committee.

SMOKING and CONSUMPTION of ALCOHOL will be prohibited during a session of continuous games. Contravening this rule will evoke penalties defined in the TBA Code of Conduct.

INJURY/DAMAGES - Participants and visitors indemnify TBA from any injury, accident and damage to equipment whilst competing during the championships or visiting the centre.

MOBILE PHONES Competitors mobile phones must be turned off while competing in an event.

TENPIN BOWLING AUSTRALIA 2004 SENIORS CUP

ELIGIBILITY - This tournament is open to all TBA affiliated bowlers who meet the following age requirements. Men and Women 50 Years and over on or prior to the first day of the National Adult Championships. Proof of age may be requested. (Must have been born prior to 12/10/1954).

FORMAT - This is a scratch event with separate divisions for Men and Women. The competition is in two (2) separate stages.

Stage 1- Qualifying - Qualifying will be the highest three (3) game singles or doubles attempt bowled during the TBA Adult National Championships or the ATBSO National Championships. Qualifying will cease on completion of the 6.00pm squad Tuesday 12th October. Any three (3) game singles or doubles attempt used for Seniors Cup qualifying will incur an additional fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating.

All bowlers (including the Defending Champions) must have paid for an "All Events" entry prior to this event.

Proof of an "All Events" entry may be requested.

Stage 2 - Final - 28 Men and 28 Women qualifiers will compete in the final. The final field will be made up of the Defending Seniors Cup Champion, the various State Seniors Cup winners, and the balance based on the highest placed Men and Women qualifiers according to their qualifying scratch score. In the event of a tie for the final qualifying position, a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall will decide. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.

Finalists will bowl 6 games, with a lane change after each game, scratch pinfall to count. The field will then be cut to the top eight (8) with pinfall carrying over. The top eight will then play seven (7) games of head to head with 20 bonus points for a win and 10 bonus points for a draw. Total pinfall plus bonus points will determine the overall winners. In the event of a tie, a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall will decide. Bonus points will not count. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.

TENPIN BOWLING AUSTRALIA 2004 RESTRICTED CUP

ELIGIBILITY - This a handicap event based on 100% of 200 and is open to all Adult TBA affiliated bowlers whose averages are **169 and Under for Men** and **159 and Under for Women**. To be eligible to compete in the final, every bowler (including the Defending Champions) must have completed an "All Events" entry in the 2004 Adult National Championships.

FORMAT - Handicap event with divisions for Men and Women and conducted in two (2) separate stages.

Qualifying - Qualifying will be the highest three (3) game singles or doubles plus handicap attempt bowled during the Australian Adult Championships. Qualifying will cease on completion of the 11.00am squad Thursday 21st October. Any Singles or Doubles attempt used for Restricted Cup qualifying will incur an additional qualifying fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating.

Final—The Defending Champion (if eligible) plus the State Representatives and the highest qualifiers to make a field of 28 will go into the Final according to their qualifying scores. In the event of a tie for the final qualifying position a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall plus entering handicap will decide. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.

STAGE ONE—ELIMINATION FINAL— Finalists will play 4 games, with a lane change after each game. The top 16 bowlers in each division on total scratch plus entering handicap pinfall will advance to Stage 2, being seeded 1 through 16 in order of pinfall. In the event of a tie the above rule will apply.

STAGE TWO—DOUBLE ELIMINATION FINAL— Each match is contested over two games with scratch pinfall plus entering handicap determining the winner. A player may lose twice before being eliminated. In the case of a tie, one additional game will be bowled. If a further tie occurs, a 10th frame playoff will take place to break the tie. If after the Stage 1 Elimination Final, a bowler is unable to continue in Stage 2, the next qualifier from Stage 1, will be invited to play.

To be eligible to compete in the final, every bowler (including the Defending Champions) must have completed an "All Events" entry in the 2004 Adult National Championships.

FORMAT - This is a scratch event with separate divisions for Men and Women and is conducted in two (2) separate stages.

Stage 1- Qualifying - Qualifying will be the highest three (3) game singles or doubles attempt bowled during the Australian Adult Championships until completion of the 6.00pm squad on Sunday 24th October. Any Singles or Doubles attempt used for Classic Cup qualifying will incur an additional qualifying fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating.

Stage 2 - Final - 20 Men and 20 Women qualifiers will compete in the final. The final field will be made up of the Defending Champions (if eligible) and the balance based on the highest placed Men and Women qualifiers according to their qualifying scratch score. In the event of a tie for the final qualifying position, a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall will decide. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken. Finalists will bowl 6 games, scratch pinfall to count. The field will then be cut to the top eight (8) with pinfall carrying over. The top eight (8) will then play seven (7) games of head to head with 20 bonus points for a win and 10 bonus points for a draw. Total pinfall plus bonus points will determine the overall winners. In the event of a tie, a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall will decide. Bonus points will not count. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.

FORMAT - Qualifying will be the highest 3 game Singles or Doubles attempt bowled during the Championships. Qualifying will cease on completion of the 11.00am squad Tuesday 26th October. Any singles or doubles attempt used for Masters qualifying will incur an additional qualifying fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating. Seeded number one will be the Defending Champion if available. All other bowlers will be seeded as to their highest single score to make up the field with State and Territory Masters Champions to the total of 32 bowlers. If any Masters Champion does not exercise their right to participate in the Final, the number of qualifying positions available will be increased by one for each right not exercised. To be eligible to compete in the final, every bowler (including the Defending Champions) must have completed an "All Events" entry in the 2004 Adult National Championships. Bowlers reporting after the advertised check-in time, will be disqualified and replaced by the next available reserve.

FINALS Women check-in by 1.00pm for 1.30pm Start on Tuesday 26th October

Men check-in by 6.30pm for 7.00pm Start on Tuesday 26th October

COST Cost of final will be \$110 - \$120 for Defending Champion and State Masters Champions

THE PLAYING FORMAT WILL BE 32 MASTERS DOUBLE ELIMINATION SYSTEM

Each match will be played over three (3) games with one (1) point for each game won. Match is won by the bowler who wins two (2) points. In case of a tied game, an additional 9th and 10th frame play-off will occur until the tie is broken. A player may lose 2 matches before being eliminated. Bowlers will have their seeding position determined by the Tournament Committee.

COST PER TEAM \$150

Qualifying - Teams of three (3) will play 6 games in A or B squad. Top 8 teams will be announced at the completion of qualifying.

Final - The Final for the top eight teams will start at 9.00am Friday, 15th October 2004. Format will be head to head with one (1) point for a win and two (2) points for a team win. All points will be decided on pinfall plus handicap. Presentations and payout of prizes will be made at the completion of the final.
