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RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

RULES - All TBA Tournament Rules and Regulations will apply.

Tournament Accreditation Number A06/00011 & A06/00012.

ELIGIBILITY - This tournament is open to all TBA Registered Players in good standing and who have attained the age of 18 years on or prior to the first day of the Championship. Current TBA Registered Player Cards must be presented at check-in.

NO REFUND AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE - Teams or Individuals who do not bowl in their allocated squads will not be entitled to claim a refund. Teams or Individuals who are unable to bowl in their event, can sell their spot to another competitor. Whilst the Tournament Committee will help where possible to reschedule entries, it is not the responsibility of the Tournament committee to sell or recover money for unused entries.

DRESS CODE - Bowler's must wear neat acceptable attire. No jeans, T shirts, tank tops or hats are to be worn whilst competing.

ENTERING AVERAGES - Each bowler must use their highest current league average as at the 30th June 2006 which has been established over a minimum of 18 games in a TBA Accredited League and including Touring Leagues.

GRADINGS - Based on averages submitted, entries will be Graded in accordance with the Australian Adult Championship Gradings Table.

BOWLERS WITHOUT AN AVERAGE - Any bowler without an average as described, may apply to TBA for classification prior to submitting an entry. If no such application is received, then an entering average of 199 for Men and 189 for Women will apply.

Note: Any bowler may enter in OPEN Grade.

AVERAGE REVIEW - The Tournament Director reserves the right to review the average and regrade any bowler at any time. Participation using an incorrect average may result in disqualification.

REPLACEMENTS - Any change from the original Entry or line-up must be reported to the Tournament Room prior to the scheduled starting time.

GAMES TO BE PLAYED - In each Grade a three (3) game series will be played in Teams, Doubles and Singles.

MULTIPLE PARTICIPATION -

TEAMS - The same five (5) bowlers may bowl together any number

of times and in any different combination.

DOUBLES - Bowlers may have unlimited entries with the same or different partner.

SINGLES - Bowlers may have unlimited entries in their grade or any grade above their own classification.

ALL EVENTS - An All Events Champion will be declared for each average classification for which paid entries are received. Scores from each bowler's BEST appearance in Teams, Doubles and Singles will count towards their All Events total. Scores in the Mixed Doubles and Mixed Teams **can** count towards All Events.

Eligibility is subject to the payment of the **\$5.00 ALL EVENTS FEE**. This Fee must be paid BEFORE bowling in their first Event.

PRIZE FUND - Trophies, medallions, shirts, awards and any other prizes will be purchased from the total prize fund received in each event. The Championship prize fund distributed in cash or cheque, will be the balance remaining after purchases have been made and will be paid in the ratio of one (1) prize for every ten (10) entries, except in All Events where the ratio will be one (1) prize for every twenty (20) entries.

NOTE - Any matters arising which are not covered by these Tournament Rules will be determined by the TBA Tournament Committee.

SMOKING and CONSUMPTION of ALCOHOL will be prohibited during a session of continuous games. Contravening this rule will incur penalties defined in the TBA Code of Conduct.

INJURY/DAMAGES - Participants and visitors indemnify TBA from any injury, accident and damage to equipment whilst competing during the championship or visiting the centre.

TENPIN BOWLING AUSTRALIA 2006 SENIORS CUP

ELIGIBILITY - This tournament is open to all TBA affiliated bowlers who meet the following age requirements . Men and Women must have had their 50th birthday before the 1st of January 2006. Proof of age may be requested.

FORMAT - This is a scratch event with separate divisions for Men and Women. The competition is in two (2) separate stages.

Stage 1 Qualifying - Qualifying will be the highest three (3) game singles or doubles attempt bowled during the TBA National Championship or the ATBSO National Championship. Qualifying will cease on completion of the 6.00pm squad Wednesday 11th October. Any three (3) game singles or doubles attempt used for Seniors Cup qualifying will incur an additional fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating.

All bowlers (including the Defending Champions) must have paid for an "All Events" entry prior to this event.

Proof of an "All Events" entry may be requested.

Stage 2 Final - 24 Men and 24 Women qualifiers will compete in the final. The final field will be made up of the Defending Seniors Cup Champion, the various State Seniors representatives, and the balance based on the highest placed Men and Women qualifiers according to their qualifying scratch score. In the event of a tie for the final qualifying position, a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall will decide. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken. Finalists will bowl 6 games, with a lane change after each game, scratch pinfall to count. The field will then be cut to the top eight (8) with pinfall carrying over. The top eight will then play seven (7) games of head to head with 20 bonus points for a win and 10 bonus points for a draw. Total pinfall plus bonus points will determine the overall winners. In the event of a tie, a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall will decide. Bonus points will not count. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.

ELIGIBILITY - This a handicap event based on 100% of 200 and is open to all Adult TBA affiliated bowlers whose averages are 184 and Under for Men and 174 and Under for Women. To be eligible to compete in the final, every bowler (including the Defending Champions) must have completed an "All Events" entry in the TBA National Championship.

FORMAT - Handicap event with divisions for Men and Women and conducted in two (2) separate stages.

Qualifying - Qualifying will be the highest three (3) game singles or doubles plus handicap attempt bowled during the TBA National Championship. Qualifying will cease on completion of the 11.00am squad Friday 20th October. Any Singles or Doubles attempt used for Restricted Cup qualifying will incur an additional qualifying fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating.

Final—The Defending Champion (if eligible) plus the State Representatives and the highest qualifiers to make a field of 24 will go into the Final according to their qualifying scores. In the event of a tie for the final qualifying position a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall plus entering handicap will decide. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.

STAGE ONE—ELIMINATION FINAL— All finalists, who have competed in the Walter De Veer Restricted Challenge, will have their average re-graded to match their De Veer entering average. Finalists will play 4 games, with a lane change after each game. STAGE TWO—SINGLE ELIMINATION FINAL— Each match will be the best of 3 games with scratch pinfall plus entering handicap determining the winner of each game. Any Singles or Doubles attempt used for Classic Cup qualifying will incur an additional qualifying fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating.

Stage 2 - Final - 24 Men and 24 Women qualifiers will compete in the final. The final field will be made up of the Defending Champions (if eligible) and the balance based on the highest placed Men and Women qualifiers according to their qualifying scratch score. Non Open Grade bowlers will have their All Events included in the points calculation and yet still remain in consideration for the as entered All Events grade. TBA Accreditation No. A06/00014.



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TBA AUSTRALIAN OPEN MASTERS

Eligibility - This is a scratch event which is open to all adult bowlers affiliated with Tenpin Bowling Australia Limited. To be eligible to compete in the final, every bowler (including the Defending Champions) must have completed an "All Events" entry in the TBA Australian National Championship.

Qualifying - Qualifying series will be the highest three (3) game singles or doubles attempt bowled during the TBA Australian Championship until completion of the 12.30pm squad on Friday 27th October. Any Singles or Doubles attempt used for qualifying will incur an additional qualifying fee of \$10.00 (Ten dollars) which must be paid prior to the squad in which the bowler is participating.

Seedings - Seeded number one will be the Defending champion, if still eligible. Seeded number two to four will be next top 3 qualifiers from the TBA National Championship. Seeded five to sixteen will be the twelve top averages from the Walter Rachuig Trophy Tournament seeded in order of average obtained over a minimum of 12 games during Walter Rachuig Trophy Tournament. State and Territory Masters Champions will be seeded amongst the qualifiers based upon their highest Singles or Doubles attempt. If any State or Territory Masters Champion does not exercise their right to participate in the Final, the number of qualifying positions available will be increased by one for each right not exercised. Seeded seventeen to forty will be the next top 24 qualifiers from the TBA National Championship including State and Territory Masters Champions. If there is a duplication of qualifiers after Walter Rachuig Trophy Tournament then that bowlers highest seeding position will apply and the next highest reserve will fill the position.

Final – Round 1

Bowlers seeded positions 1 through 4 will receive a double round bye to Round 3. Bowlers seeded positions 5 through 16 will receive a single round bye to Round 2. Bowlers filling qualifying positions 17 through 40 will compete in Round 1 single elimination format. Each match will be the best of 5 games.

Final – Round 2

Bowlers seeded positions 5 through 16 will be seeded and compete against the winners from Round 1. Each match will be the best of 5 games.

Final – Round 3

Bowlers seeded positions 1 through 4 will be seeded and compete against the winners from Round 2. Each match will be the best of 5 games.

Final – Round 4

Winners from Round 3 will compete in a single elimination format. Each match will be the best of 5 games. Round 4 Losers will finish 5th equal for the purposes of prize fund distribution.

Final – Semi Final

Winners from the Quarter Finals will compete in a single elimination format. Each match will be the best of 5 games. Semi Final Losers will finish 3rd for the purposes of prize fund distribution.

Final – Grand Final

Winners from the Semi Finals will compete in a single elimination format. Each match will be the best of 5 games. The Winner will be declared the 2006 Australian Masters Champion.

Ties - In the event of any ties in a match, total pinfall over the 5 games in a match will determine the winner of that match. Any subsequent tie will require a 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.
